### RETENTION

The Retention outcome threshold set by the CoAEMSP is 70% and based on the Retention/Attrition formula. Once the Attrition percentage has been determined, then the Retention percentage is 100% minus the Attrition percentage.

**Detailed analysis for retention outcome:**

Cohort #1 started with 35 students enrolled.

School policy states that all students must maintain an 80% GPA. There are 11 high stakes block exams, daily quizzes, the drug & protocol final exam, and the comprehensive final exam. There is no re-take on any exam or quiz. Students may gain extra credit to help maintain their GPA. Any student whose didactic GPA is below 80% is not eligible to take the final drug & protocol exam or the comprehensive final. They have failed didactic and must re-take the didactic portion.

Students take the final capstone graded simulations in the third semester. They must maintain an 80% GPA. If they fail 3 SIMS, they are eligible to a re-take day. If they fail 4 SIMS, they fail the overall graded simulations and must enter either move on to the remediation program or start the program from the beginning.

Eligible students move on to the Clinical Rotations. At the end of Clinicals, they return for Oral Boards. If a student scores below 80% he/she is eligible to re-take on another day. The passing score for OB retakes is 85%. If a student scores below 85% on the re-take he/she has failed OB and must move on to the remediation program or start the program from the beginning.

Cohort #2 was the third semester and had 6 students enrolled

Third semester is the remediation program for those students who were unsuccessful in their original cohort and gives them an opportunity to pass the program on their second try.

Cohort #3 started with 20 students enrolled.

School policy states that all students must maintain an 80% GPA. There are 11 high stakes block exams, daily quizzes, the drug & protocol final exam, and the comprehensive final exam. There is no re-take on any exam or quiz. Students may gain extra credit to help maintain their GPA. Any student whose didactic GPA is below 80% is not eligible to take the final drug & protocol exam or the comprehensive final. They have failed didactic and must re-take the didactic portion.

Students take the final capstone graded simulations in the third semester. They must maintain an 80% GPA. If they fail 3 SIMS, they are eligible to a re-take day. If they fail 4 SIMS, they fail the overall graded simulations and must enter either move on to the remediation program or start the program from the beginning.

Eligible students move on to the Clinical Rotations. At the end of Clinicals, they return for Oral Boards. If a student scores below 80% he/she is eligible to re-take on another day. The passing score for OB retakes is 85%. If a student scores below 85% on the re-take he/she has failed OB and must move on to the remediation program or start the program from the beginning.

Cohort #4 was the third semester and had 6 students enrolled

Third semester is the remediation program for those students who were unsuccessful in their original cohort and gives them an opportunity to pass the program on their second try.

Cohort #1: 10 students failed the didactic portion of the program, either the drug & protocol final or the comprehensive final exam; 2 students withdrew from the program for personal reasons; 2 students took an LOA in didactic for personal reasons

Cohort #3: 6 students failed the didactic portion of the program, either the drug & protocol final or the comprehensive final exam; 3 students took an LOA for medical reasons

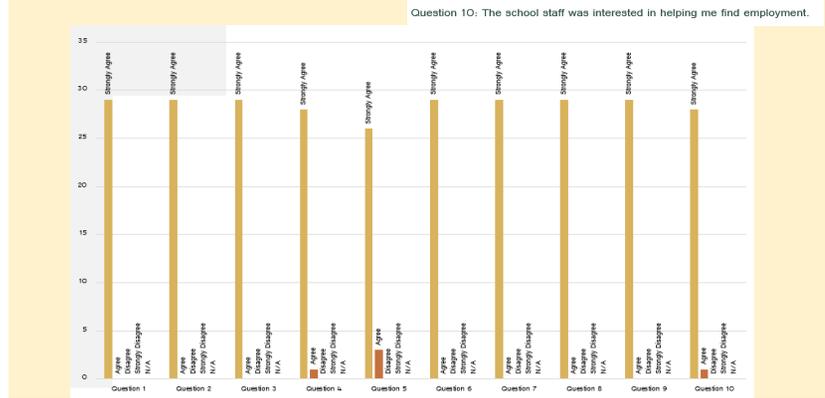
